Thank you. We rely on dedicated donors, such as yourselves, to help fund our school and develop our programs, facilities, and equipment. There are always abounding needs that require attention. In the past few years, thanks to donations, we have been able to renovate the Learning Hub to be more functional for private and semiprivate sessions and meetings with students. Our Educational Assistants and Literacy programs use it regularly! If you have visited the school recently, you will have noticed two new modular classrooms being installed on the upper parking lot. This is possible because of decades of faithful, generous donors who are committed to our vision of honouring God by preparing Christian leaders of tomorrow to serve Jesus Christ.

We desire to educate for life. Our mission is to teach students to know God, His Word and His world, challenging students to excel, yet with humility, serve God and humanity. These new classrooms will help with that mission. Moving grades 6 & 7 to the modular classrooms establishes a middle school environment, allows our high school to have 60 fewer bodies in the hallways and bathrooms, gives our high school students a lunch room/study space, and opens up a new classroom for new instructional purposes.

These donor-funded initiatives support our current and future focus of improving our student experience. From new equipment, modulars, renovations, and more, we are constantly striving to develop our school so our students have a great experience of learning in Christian community. Our school theme this year is "Guided by the Truth" from John 16:13. This theme extends beyond instructional time into all facets of our school, from peer mentors to music to athletics. We plan to develop our school so that God's truth permeates every aspect of our work, resulting in a top-tier experience. Our fundraising efforts this year and in the years to come will be geared towards this goal: developing our current facilities, equipment, and course offerings so our student community can discover God's truth in a dynamic, comfortable, and holistic environment.
